Gun Plain Charter Township has an outbreak of Spongy Moths. We need your help in reducing the population. Above is a picture of what the egg sacks look like. The egg sacks need to be destroyed before they hatch in the spring. The egg sacks can be found on tree trunks, branches, lawn furniture, siding and more. To get rid of the egg sacks, scrape the egg sacks into a cup or container that you can put soapy water into for 48 hours to soak the egg sacks to destroy them. Those egg sacks that are not destroyed before spring will hatch into spongy moth caterpillars. These caterpillars will eat the leaves on your trees.
